ART 283 Graphic Animation

I. ART 283 – Graphic Animation - 3 Semester Hours

II. Course Description

This course is designed to teach the art of animation as a continuation of visual communication. Topics include story development, drawing, and layout, story boarding, directing, motion control, sound synchronization lighting and camera operation. Upon completion, students should advance his or her understanding of the creative process as it relates to animation and demonstrate this knowledge through various projects.

III. Prerequisite

IV. Textbook

Textbook will be choice of the instructor.

V. Course Objectives

- a. The Student will gain knowledge of the design principles and theories to animation production.
- b. The Student will gain an understanding of the 12 principles of animation.
- c. The Student will develop skills in the use of tools for animation.
- d. The Student will gain an appreciation for accurate, aesthetically appealing animated works.
- e. The Student will create traditional and computer generated animation.

VI. Course Activities

Class activities will include lectures and demonstrations via the ACME Distance Learning Sessions and ACME Animation Online. They will also include on campus lectures, critiques, demonstrations, field trips, slides, video presentations, and development of an animation portfolio. Weekly critiques will be required for all students.

VII. Evaluation and Assessment

Each student will be graded on their ability to complete assignments in a timely manner and on their ability to follow instructions. They must be able to critique their own work and the work of their peers, as well as have a complete final portfolio.

Grades will be given based upon A = 90 - 100%, B = 80 - 89%, C = 70 - 79%, D = 60 - 69%, and F = below 60%.

- b. The Student will demonstrate basic animation skills.
- c. The student will demonstrate the ability to analyze and critique their work, as well as the work of peers, in a constructive manner using the appropriate terminology.

- e. The Student will prepare an animation portfolio.
