# **Alabama Veterinary Medical Association Scholarship**

### **APPLICATION AND GUIDELINES**

The *Alabama Veterinary Medical Association (ALVMA) Scholarship* is awarded each year to one or more Veterinary Technology Distance Education student(s). These scholarships are awarded each summer for the fall and/or spring semesters.

#### ELIGIBILITY

- 1. Given based on academic achievement and need
  - Student must have not less than a 2.5 GPA in Veterinary Technology coursework.
  - Student must demonstrate a financial need for the scholarship
- 2. Student must complete and submit the scholarship application by **June 30**.

The **ALVMA Scholarship** is in the amount of a one thousand dollar scholarship (\$1,000). The scholarship may be used for payment of tuition and fees, student supplies for classes and labs, and textbooks. The scholarship is in addition to any other awards the student may receive.

The recipient of the **ALVMA Scholarship** shall be selected by the Jefferson State Community College Veterinary Technology Scholarship Committee. Each application will be assessed by the Committee and a top candidate shall be selected by July 15. Jefferson State's Veterinary Technology Program shall notify all applicants of their status.

In the event the recipient of the scholarship should withdraw from the Veterinary Technology Program, fail to maintain the above stipulated academic average, or has not used the scholarship money by the end of the academic school year the scholarship was awarded, the remaining amount of the scholarship shall be issued to another qualified student at the discretion of the Veterinary Technology Scholarship Committee.
