



### **Medical Laboratory Technology Minimum Admission Standards:**

1. Unconditional Admission to the College. Refer to the current college catalog for detailed requirements.
2. Receipt of completed application for the Medical Laboratory Program by the March 1 for summer admission and June 1 for fall admission.
3. Minimum of 2.5 GPA on all prerequisite coursework used in the ranking system. A minimum of 2.5 high school GPA for students without prior college work. (GED acceptable in lieu of high school transcript)
4. Eligibility for English 101 and either Math 100, 116 or higher
5. Good standing with the college. Check with admissions to make sure there are no holds on your account.
6. Meeting the essential functions required in the technical standards for MLT
7. Completion of the Accuplacer, or ACT Test scores for Math, Reading and Writing

### **MLT Program Checklist**

It is the student's responsibility to submit a **complete** MLT admissions packet. **Incomplete packets will not be accepted.** Students must initial beside each statement below to ensure that they meet the minimum admissions criteria. Meeting the minimum admissions criteria does not guarantee acceptance into the program.

1. \_\_\_\_\_ Completed application to the MLT program
2. \_\_\_\_\_ It is the applicants responsibility to have **ALL** transcripts mailed directly from the sending institution, including non-accrediting schools and evaluated by Jefferson State. In order for you application to be complete, **all documents, including official transcripts must be submitted to Enrollment Services.** If the applicant is using any high school grades, the student must turn in an Official high school transcript showing graduation date. Transcripts must be in a sealed envelope from the issuing institution. High school transcripts must also be submitted with the Colleges application.
3. \_\_\_\_\_ Each applicant is required to take the Accuplacer, or ACT Test. Students must meet the minimum reading test score of 80 on Accuplacer, 470 or 20 on ACT.
4. \_\_\_\_\_ Calculated GPA of 2.5 on all prerequisite coursework for the degree in Medical Laboratory Technology. (see listing of curriculum under section 3 Ranking Scores).
5. \_\_\_\_\_ Must be eligible to enroll in ENG 101 or have taken ENG 101 and must be eligible to enroll in MTH 116, 100 or higher or have taken MTH 116, 100 or higher. Refer to the current Jefferson State Community College catalog for course pre-requisites or placement test score requirements.

Admission to the Associate Degree MLT Program is competitive, and the number of students is limited by the number of clinical facilities available. **Meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee acceptance.**

1. **ACADEMIC COURSEWORK (12 Possible Points)**
