<p>**Optional: Applicants will be granted additional points for observational/shadowing or volunteer experiences in a respiratory therapy setting. ALL hours must be supervised and signed by a licensed RT using official JSCC RT Program Observation Forms. Hours must involve exposure in a hospital-based acute care setting, inpatient facility or physician clinic. Observational hours must also be achieved within 1 year of the deadline date to be considered for the admission ranking score.</p> <p>20 or more hours = 5 points, 17-19 hours = 4 points, 14-16 hours = 3 points, 11-13 hours = 2 points, 8-10 hours = 1 point</p>	5.0
