Nursing Program Application Checklist

- Unconditional admission to the college. Refer to the current college catalog for detailed requirements.
- □ Must be in good standing with the College including a minimum overall, cumulative GPA of 2.0.
- Completed nursing application. Incomplete applications will not be accepted. <u>ALL</u> official college transcripts must be on file in the Admissions Office by the application deadline. All transcripts must be final, no 'in progress' or 'partial' transcripts will be considered.
- Must have a minimum composite score of 18 on the National or Residual ACT test. ACT scores do not expire, effective as of October 13, 2022, until further notice. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that official ACT scores are on file in the Admissions Office by the application deadline. For help on viewing scores, check out the You Tube Channel for instructions: <u>https://www.jeffersonstate.edu/howto-view-test-scores/</u>. SAT scores are not accepted.
- Minimum of 2.5 GPA is required on academic core college courses. The core college courses include: ENG101, MTH100 or higher, BIO201, BIO202, BIO220, PSY210*, SPH106 or 107 & Humanities elective.
- Minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA at current, native institution or cumulative 2.0 GPA at institution from which student is transferring.
- Minimum of 2.5 high school GPA for students without prior college courses (GED will be used if applicable).
- Day Program only: must be eligible to enroll in ENG 101 or have taken ENG101 and must be eligible to enroll in MTH 100 or higher or have taken MTH 100 or higher. <u>Note:</u> MTH 116 is no longer accepted for the nursing program.
- Evening Program only: <u>All</u> academic core college courses must be completed prior to the application deadline. These include ENG 101, MTH 100 or higher, BIO201, BIO202, SPH106 or 107, PSY210*, BIO220 & Humanities Elective.
- □ Meet the essential functions required for nursing.
- □ Must pass a background check by the scheduled Mandatory deadline.
- □ Must pass a drug screening before attending clinical rotations.
- Mandatory Orientation Conference is required of all students admitted to the Nursing Education Program (NEP). Students are required to attend on the date scheduled by the program. Failure to attend may result in forfeiting your admittance into the NEP. Refer to the FAQs on the NEP webpage for more information.

Admission to the associate degree nursing program is competitive, and the number of students is limited by the number of faculty and clinical facilities available. <u>Meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee acceptance</u>.

The nursing education program is currently undergoing revision. Published guidelines and requirements are subject to change without notice. Updated information will be posted on the Jefferson State web site as available.

^{*}PSY 200 is a prerequisite for PSY 210 but will not be counted in GPA. For pre-nursing students only, PSY 200 will be waived as a prerequisite for PSY 210.
