It is important that you meet **all** requirements before applying. ***If you are missing any of the requirements, your application will be incomplete.***

	College admissions application. Unconditionally admitted to the college. Refer to the current catalog for detailed requirements.
	Must be in good standing with the college to include a minimum overall, cumulative GPA of 2.0
	Radiology Program application. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
	Official College Transcripts from all colleges attended. ALL transcripts must be on file in the Admissions Office by the application deadline. <i>All transcripts must be final; 'in progress' or 'partial' transcripts will not be considered.</i>
	Official ACT scores A minimum ACT Composite score of 18 and a minimum Science sub-score of 18 is required for the program admission. The ACT must be completed within 5 years of the application deadline. ACT scores must be received from one of the following sources: National ACT, High School transcript or Residual ACT scores from JSCC or any community college in Alabama by the application deadline. 	I am 18 years old at the application deadline.
	Minimum Cumulative GPA of 2.5 or greater on all college courses attempted, including graduate-level.
	Eligible to enroll in MTH 100 or a higher-level math course or have taken MTH 100 or a higher-level math course. Refer to the current Jefferson State Community College catalog for course prerequisites or placement test score requirements. Note: MTH 110 and MTH 116 is a lower-level math and will not meet the curriculum requirements for the Radiology Program.
	Eligible to enroll in ENG 101 or have taken ENG 101. Refer to the current Jefferson State Community College catalog for course prerequisites or placement test score requirements.
